The Shared Care Coordinator will support the General Manager, Shared Care, in managing and delivering GPEx's shared care programs. These include the South Australian statewide Obstetrics Shared Care program

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on behalf of SA Health and the pilot GP ADHD Shared Care program in partnership with the Women's and Children's Health Network (WCHN) Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services (CAMHS) unit.

This position will focus on driving shared care, supporting GP education and accreditation, undertaking program workflows and administration, contributing to clinical governance and accreditation, and providing patient and professional navigation services.

This role offers a unique opportunity to support innovative healthcare initiatives, working at the intersection of clinical practice, education, and shared and collaborative care models.

Key Responsibilities:

Stakeholder Engagement and Program Coordination	 Support the General Manager, Shared Care, and others across GPEx, in managing the Obstetric Shared Care program and ADHD Shared Care program pilot. Liaise and partner with GP's, midwifes, nurses and other clinical and non-clinical staff to enhance systems and processes that support collaborative and shared care. Support the General Manager in identifying opportunities for enhancement of program coordination and engagement to improve health professional and patient experiences. Provide patient and professional navigation services, ensuring seamless support throughout the care process.
Education and Professional Development	 Contribute to the development and delivery of education and CPD events for GP's and health professionals, ensuring that training resources and facilitators align with program requirements and guidelines. Support the accreditation process for GPs participating in shared care programs. Contribute to the creation and delivery of resources and information for GPs and healthcare professionals at both in-person events and online by developing high-quality, on-brand content.
Administration and Data Management	 Work with GPEx staff to maintain an up-to-date database of participating GPs, and/or other health professionals ensuring compliance with program requirements and registrations. Support the onboarding and offboarding of GPs and healthcare professionals in shared care programs. Support internal reporting, documentation and soliciting program feedback via surveys to ensure effective communication of program outcomes. Help manage and distribute materials to GPs, Specialists, and other partners in the shared care program. Provide additional support as needed, such as assisting with special projects, administration or preparing presentations for internal or external stakeholders.

- Ability to engage with diverse groups in primary and tertiary care, fostering collaborative approaches to integrated patient care.
- Strong organisational skills to support shared care programs and meet clinical and operational goals.
- Strong written and verbal communication skills for delivering educational resources, writing reports, and contributing to promotional information and program communications.
